Chief Minister Sri K Chandrashekar Rao took strong exception to Private College Managements spreading misinformation about State Government's plans to strengthen education system in the State. Hon'ble CM deplored the decision of college managements to boycott TET and EAMCET exams that were scheduled to be held on May 1 and 2 respectively. Sri Chandrashekar Rao reiterated that Govt will weed out mushrooming bogus colleges and found fault with college managements opposing such move.

Hon'ble CM said that colleges are spreading rumours about inspections and reaffirmed that Vigilance Department will only conduct them. He also stated that third party institutions like BITS Pilani, IITH will also be part of the inspection teams.

In the backdrop of strike, Government has decided to postpone TET and EAMCET exams. Hon'ble CM has instructed Deputy CM and Education Minister Sri K Srihari to make preparations for completing the exams before May 20 by involving Government educational institutions, teachers and staff.

The Chief Minister made an earnest appeal to students and parents not to get panicky about the conduct of competitive exams. He said that the State Government will do everything possible to improve the educational standards in State and will not bow down to pressure from private college managements.
